Residents will have the ability to report information to several of the City's departments including:

- Communications Division
- Inspections
- Zoning
- Department of Public Works
- Health Department Animal Control
- Police Department Disabled/abandoned vehicles

Reporting is quick and simple. Residents will open the app (available on iOS and Android) or visit www.reportit.com, select the department they want to connect with, and provide information regarding their concern. Users will also be able to attach a picture or video to accompany their report. Once the report is submitted, it will be sent to appropriate personnel for review and action.

Report It connects residents directly to City officials, allowing for quick turnaround time and ultimately, an improved quality of life and security. *Report It* gives residents and visitors the opportunity to be the eyes and ears of our city. With a few quick taps, they can report their concerns and take part in keeping our communities safe.
